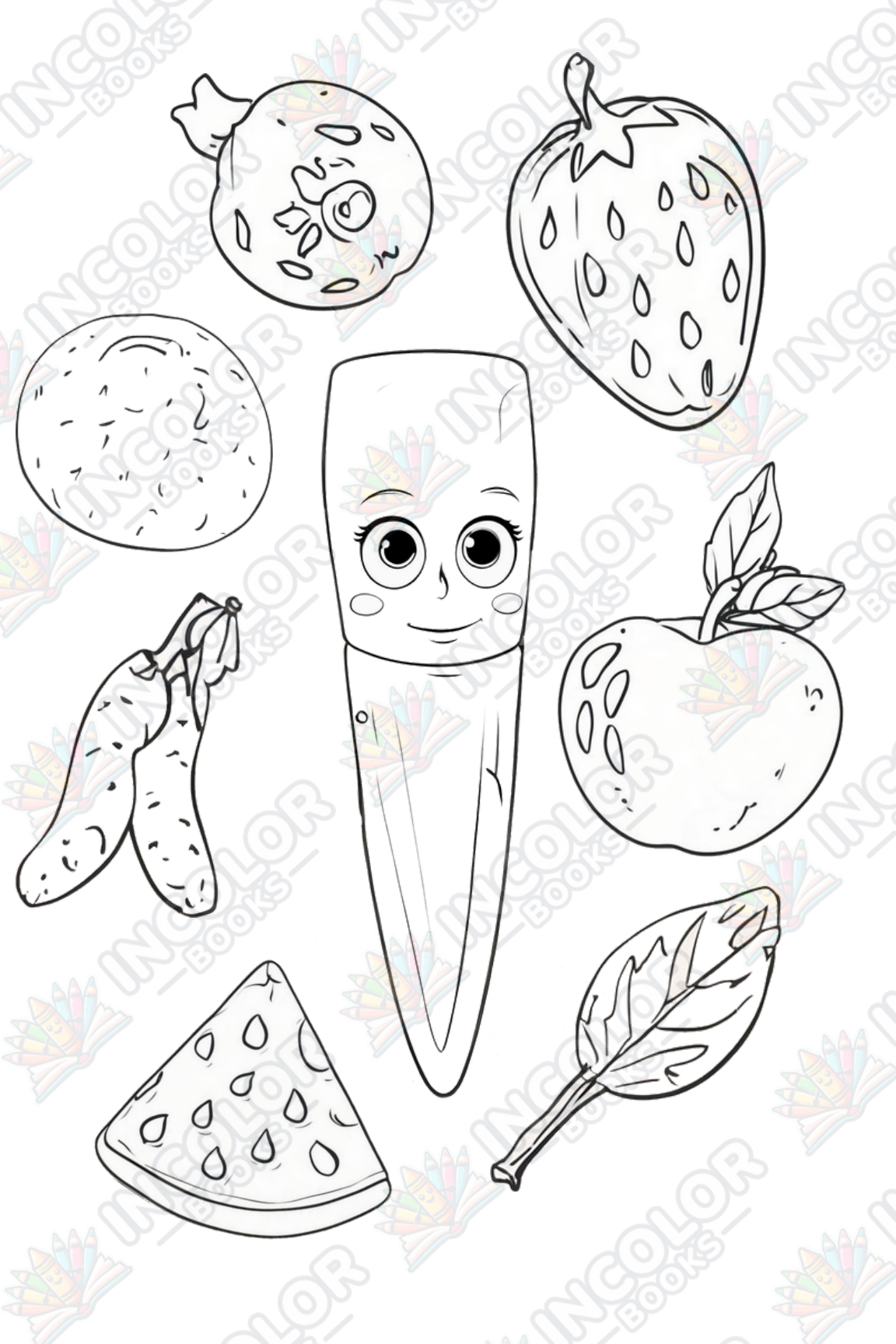

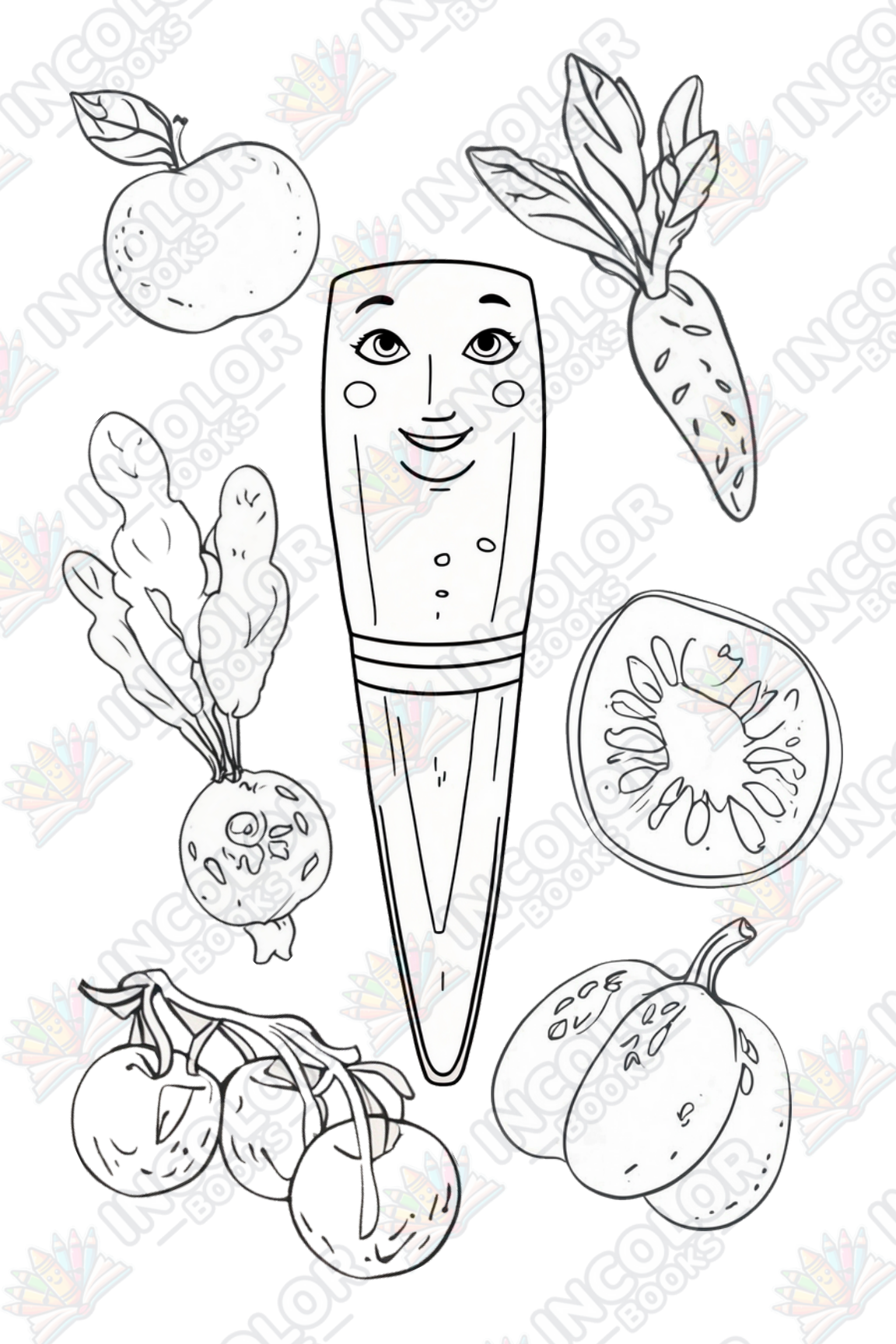

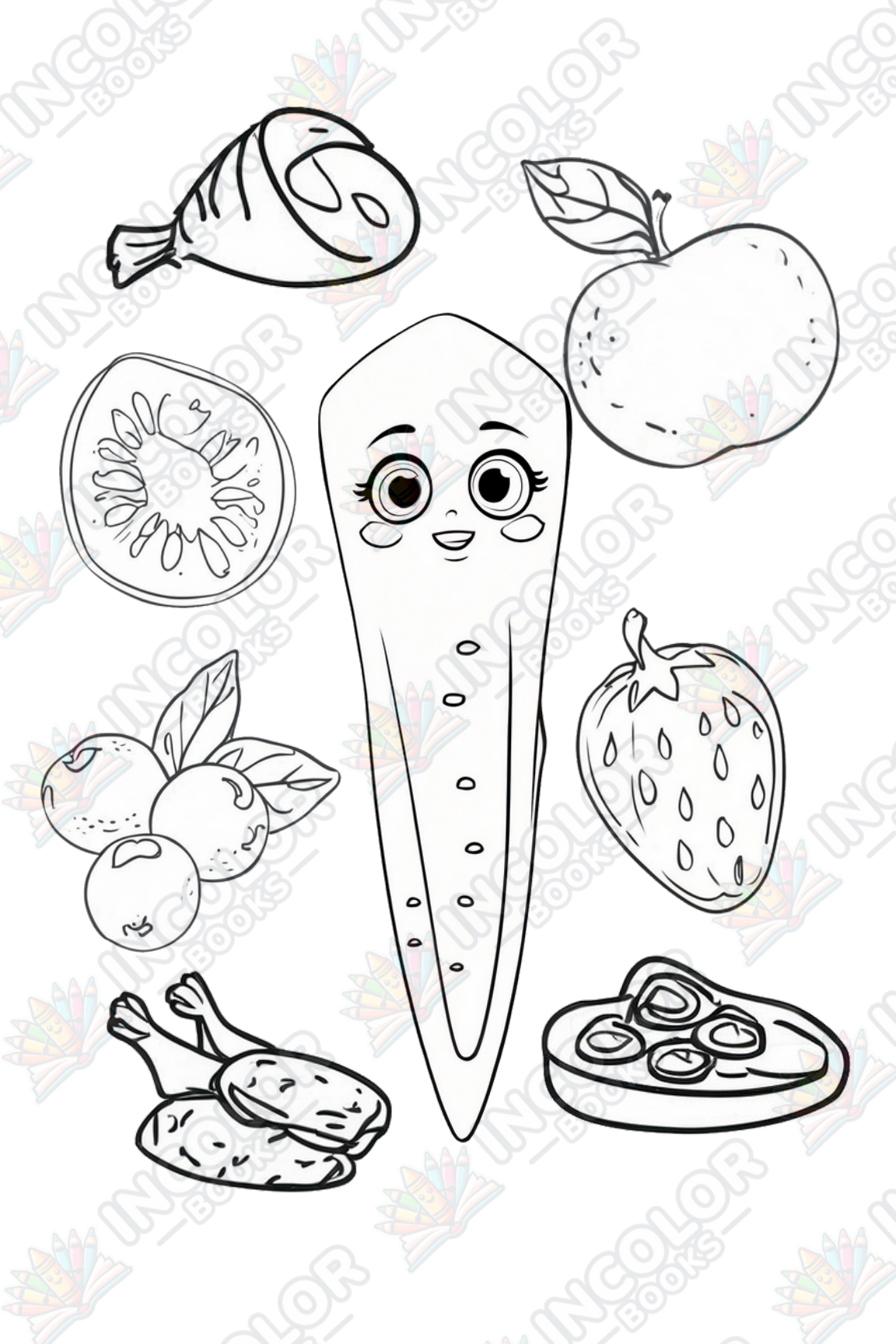
**Central Incisor:

vegetables**



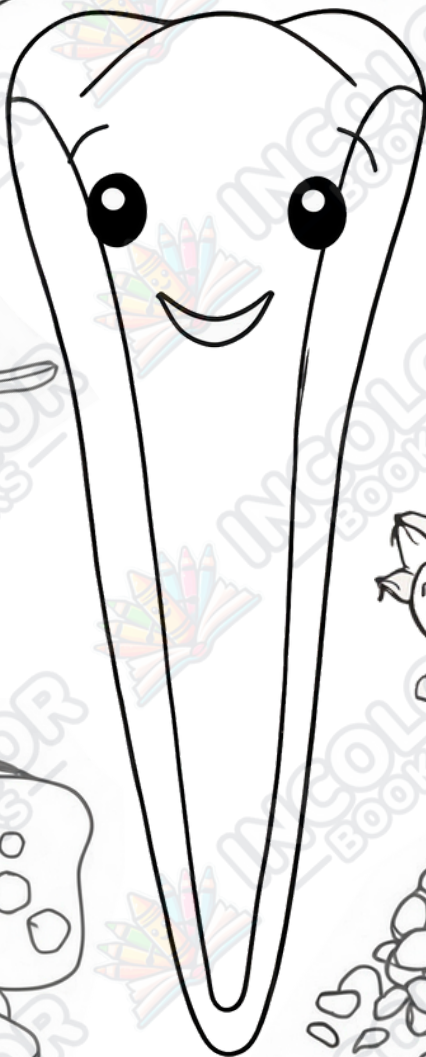
**Lateral Incisor:

molars.**



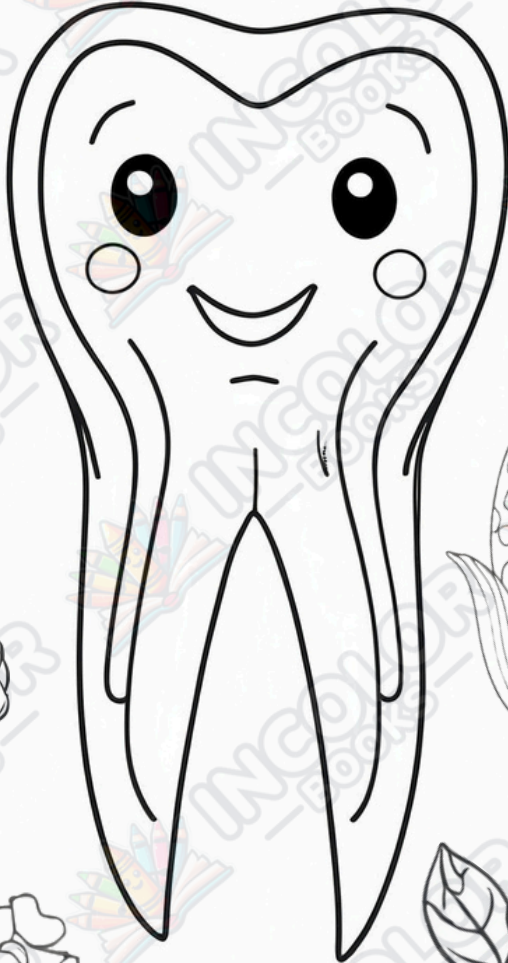
**Second Premolar or

pistachios.**



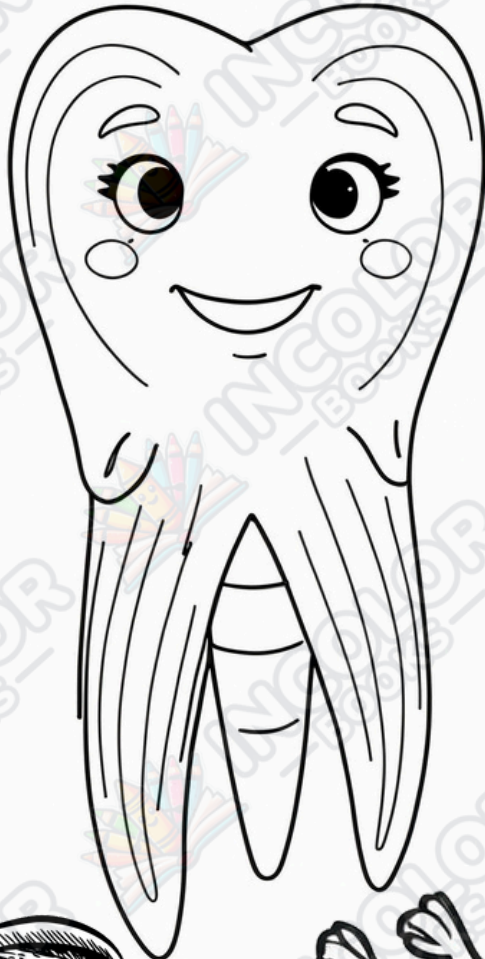
**First Molar:

small pieces.

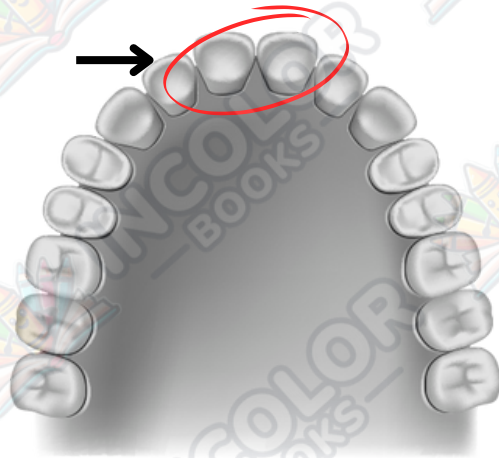


**Third Molar or

Central Incisor

The central incisor is one of the largest and most visible teeth at the front of your mouth, appearing between the ages of 6 and 8. This tooth has a straight edge, making it perfect for slicing foods like fruits and vegetables. The central incisors are the first to bite when you eat—they're like little knives that help you start enjoying your food!

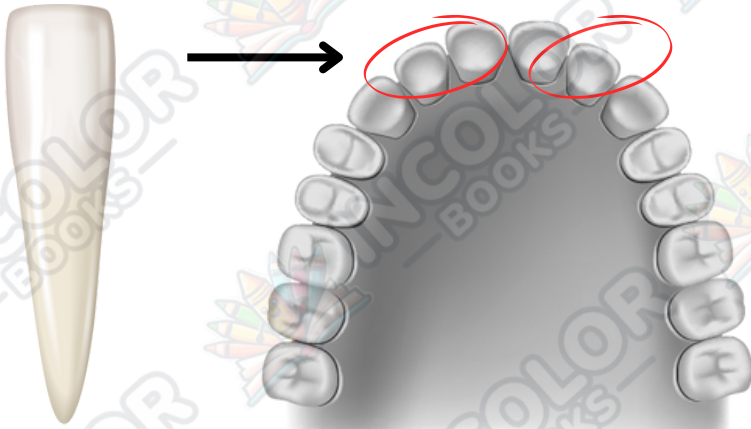

Lateral Incisor

The lateral incisor is a small, sharp tooth that appears at the front of your mouth around ages 7 or 8. This tooth is perfect for cutting foods like apples and carrots into small pieces. Lateral incisors work alongside the central incisors to help you bite and start chewing. They're like little scissors that make eating easier and more fun!

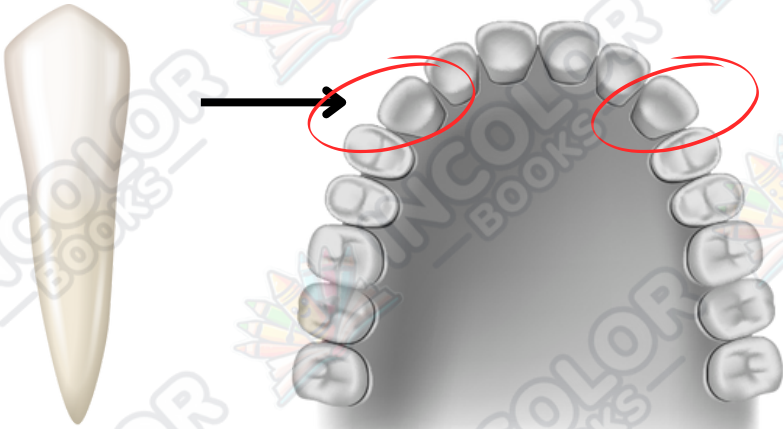

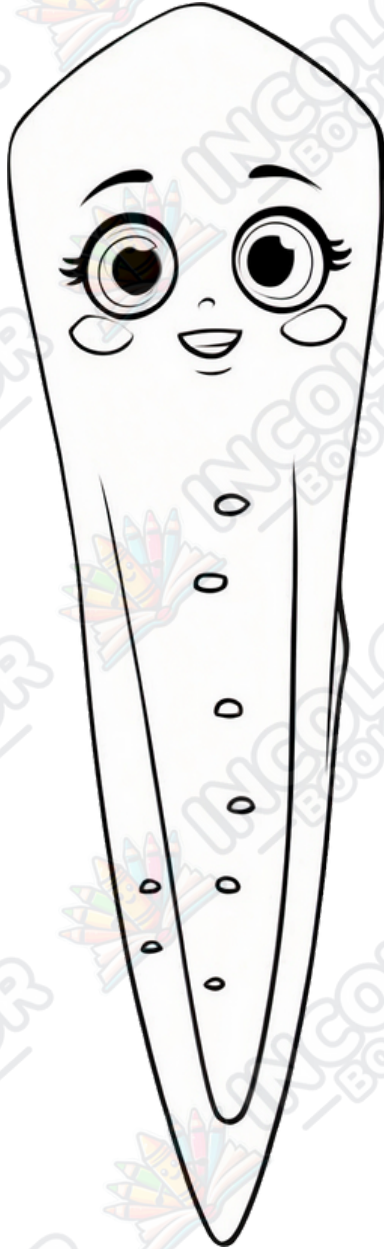


Canine

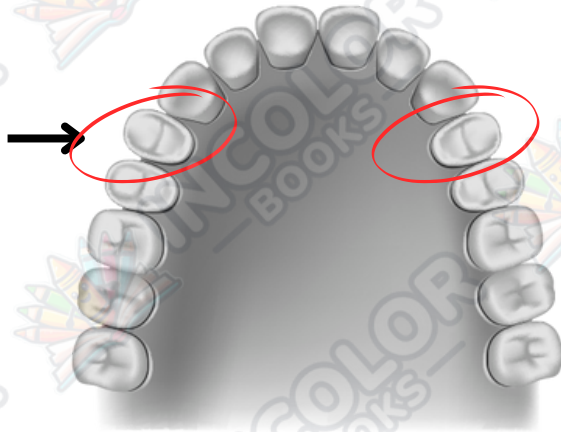

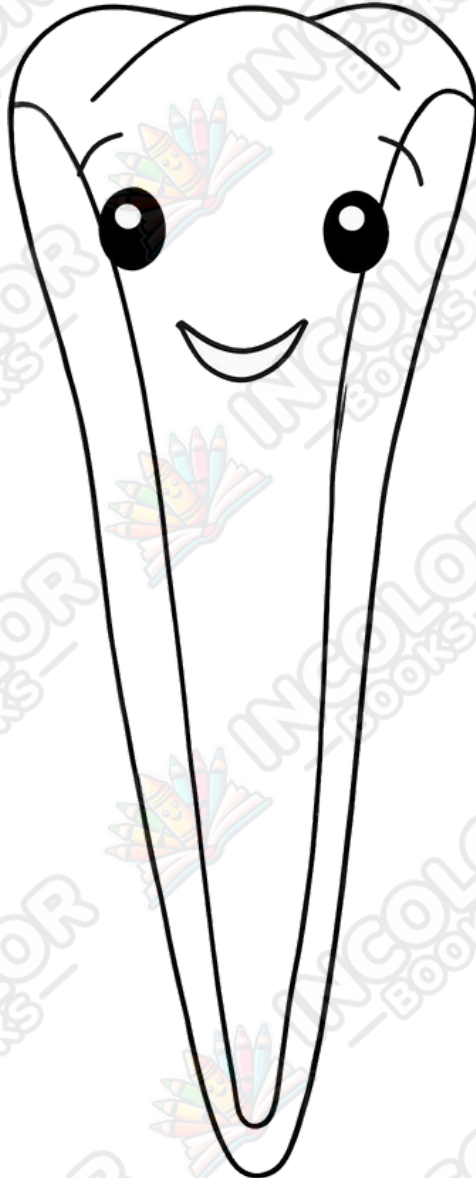


First Premolar or First Bicuspid

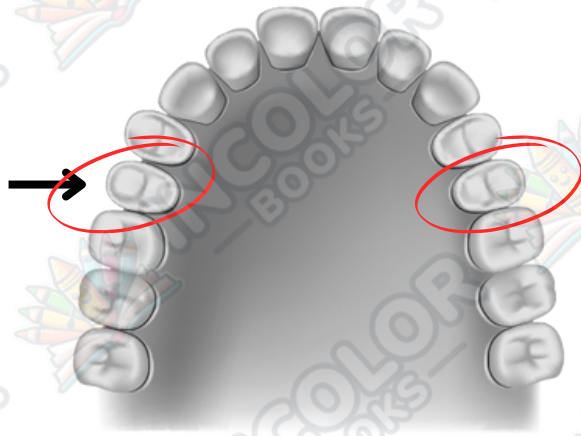

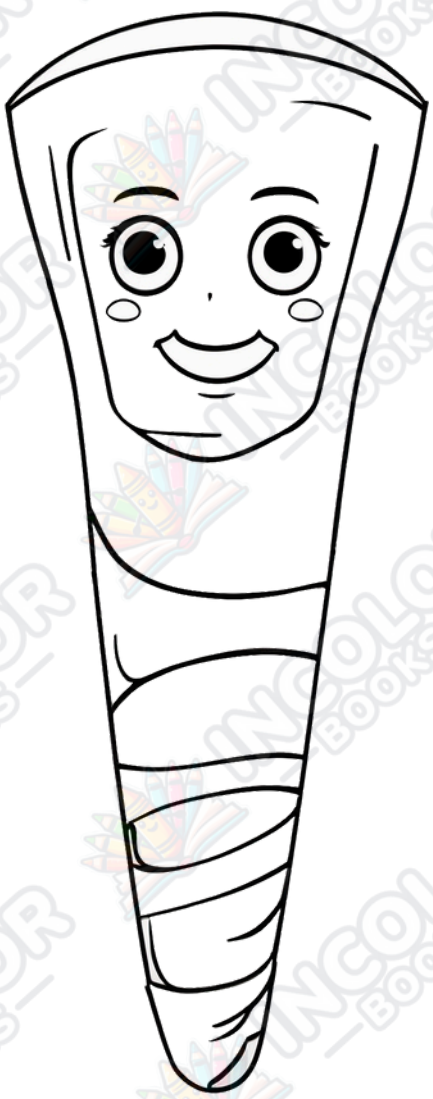


Second Premolar or Bicuspid

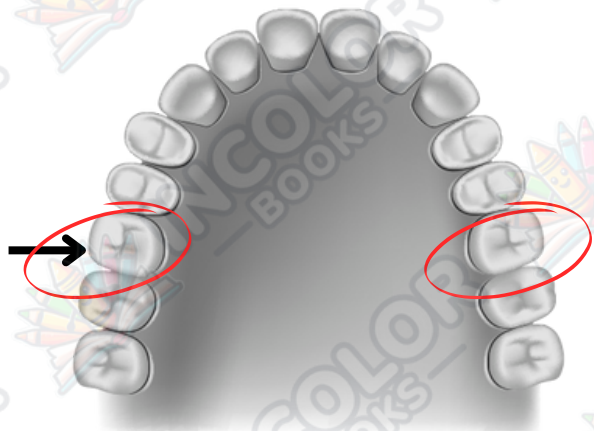


Second Premolar or Bicuspid
